Mercury Program 1961

- April Soviets launch Yuri Gagarin into space
 first man in space
- May 5 U.S. launch Alan Shepard into Space

• First American in space

 May 25 – Kennedy pledges to land a man on the moon by end of decade





Peace Corps

- Formed in 1961
- Aid in economics & education for developing countries
- Improve the image of the United States







CUBA AND FIDEL CASTRO


- Large U.S. ownership of land & business
- 2nd highest standard of living in Latin America- high literacy
- Dictator- Batista since 1951
- 1959- Castro overthrew Batista- then seized American owned companies
- Castro adopted communism for Cuba



CASTRO AND KHRUSHCHEV

- July 1960, Khrushchev gave aid to Cuba
- U.S. broke diplomatic relations with Cuba in January, 1961- one of the final acts of President Eisenhower









THE BAY OF PIGS, CUBA

- April, 1961- 1,200
 Cuban exiles set off to invade Cuba through the Bay of Pigs and overthrow Castro
- Exiles were almost immediately halted by Cuban army
- JFK refused to directly aid the invaders with additional air support





The Berlin Wall

- Exodus of East Germans to West Germany via West Berlin

- Khrushchev recommends East Germany close access between East & West Berlin
- August 12-13: 30 miles of barbed wire barrier was laid through the heart of Berlin




THE CUBAN MISSILE CRISIS



- In 1960, Soviets began transporting parts and installing nuclear missiles in Cuba
- October 16, 1962- Kennedy became aware of these missiles after ordering U-2 spy planes to fly over Cuba on Oct. 14, 1962



12 PROB GUIDELINE MISSILES




5 MISSILE DOLLIES


KENNEDY'S RESPONSE

- "Flexible Response" v. "Brinksmanship"


