

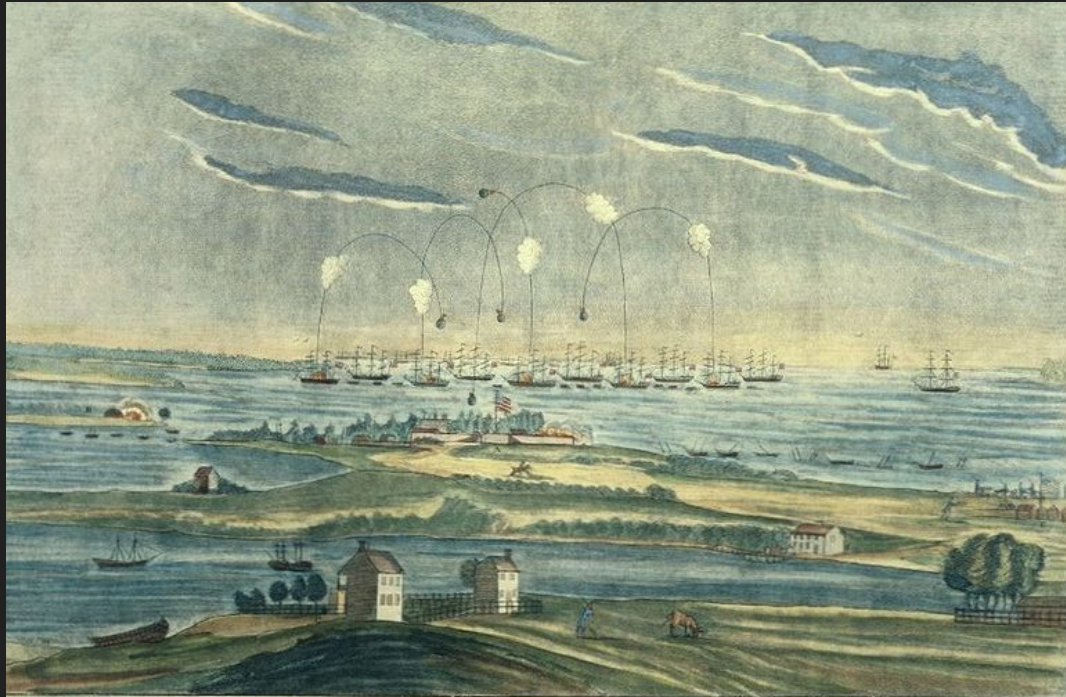

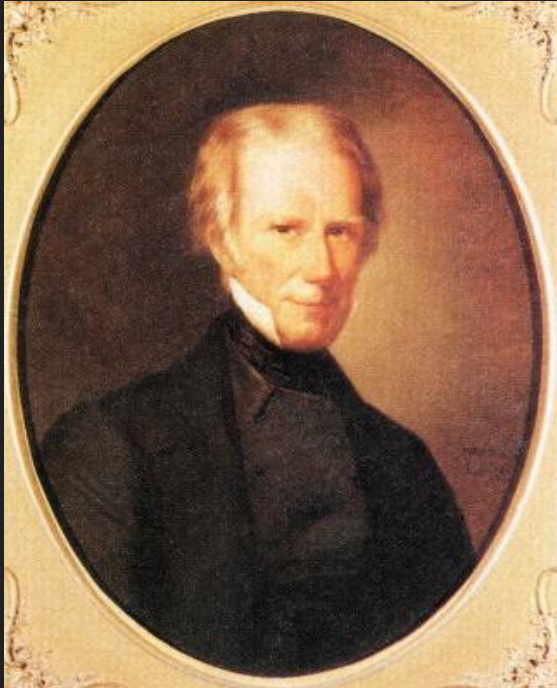
# Hartford Convention

  - Nail in the coffin for Federalist Party

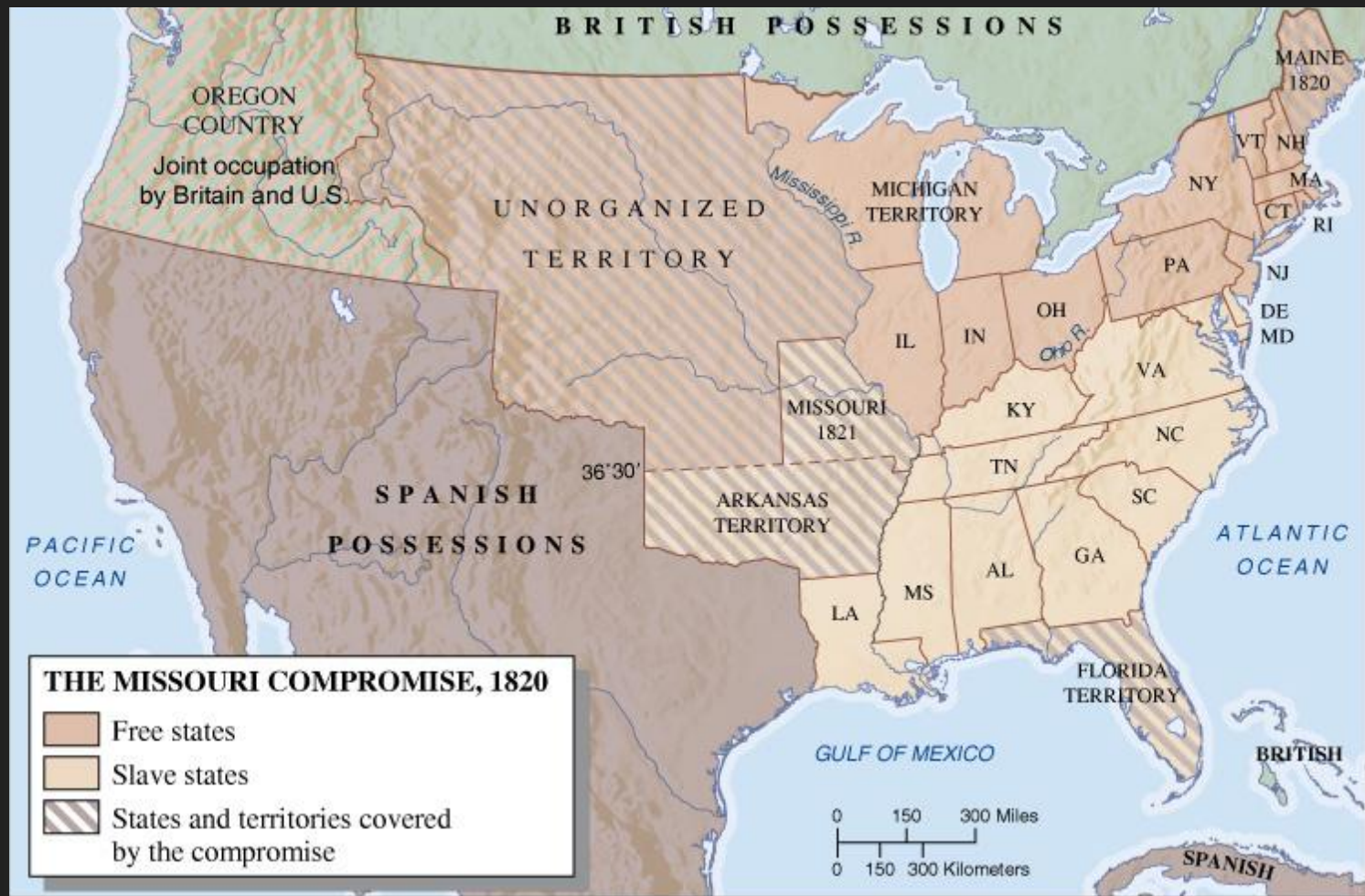

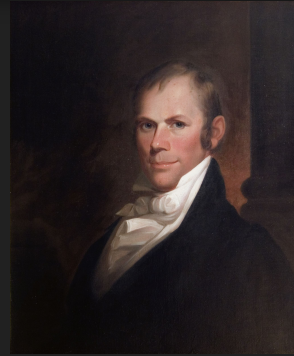

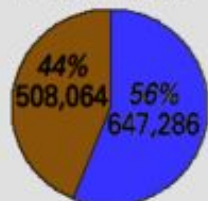

**POPULAR VOTE TOTAL: 1,155,350**

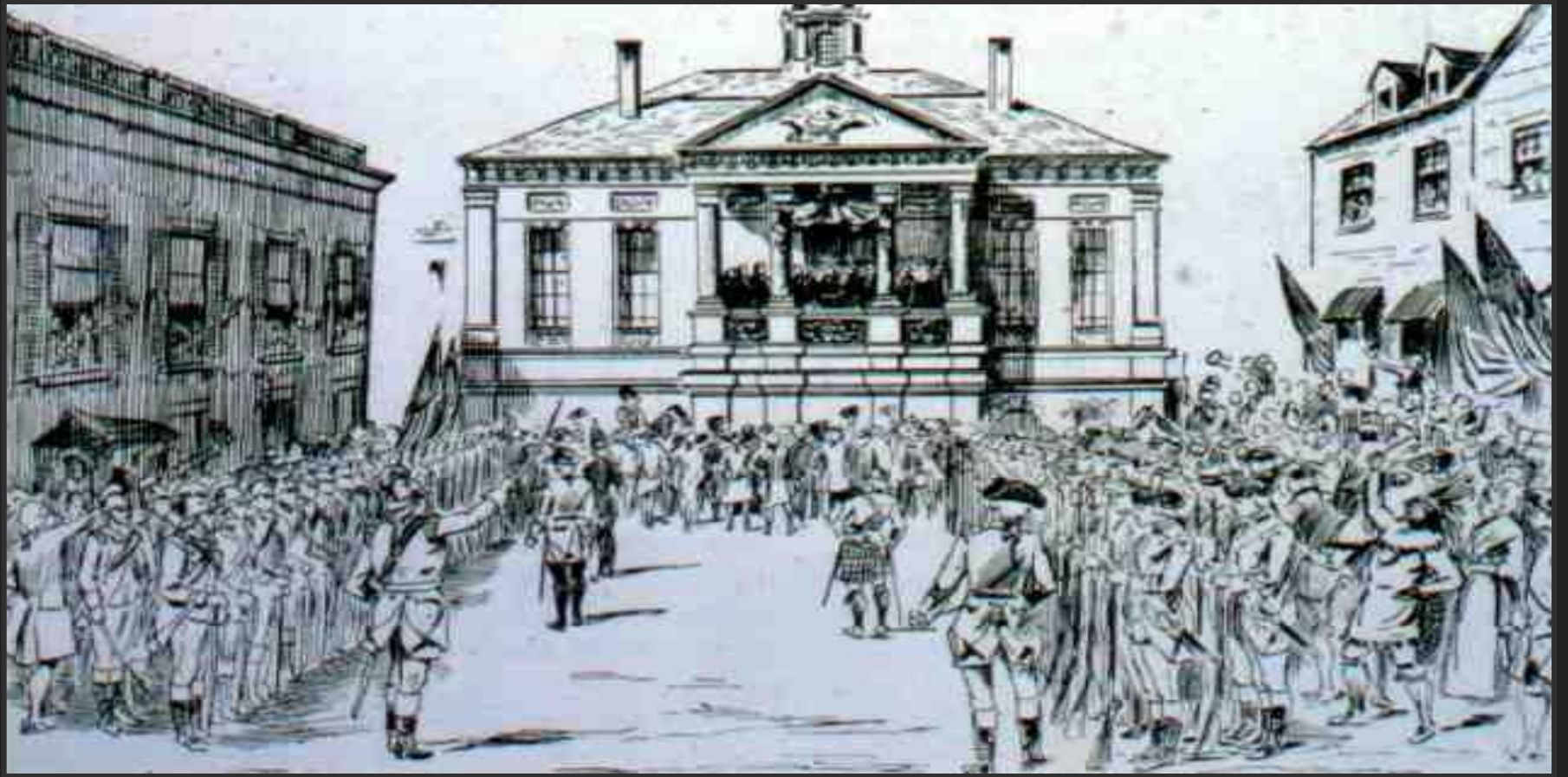

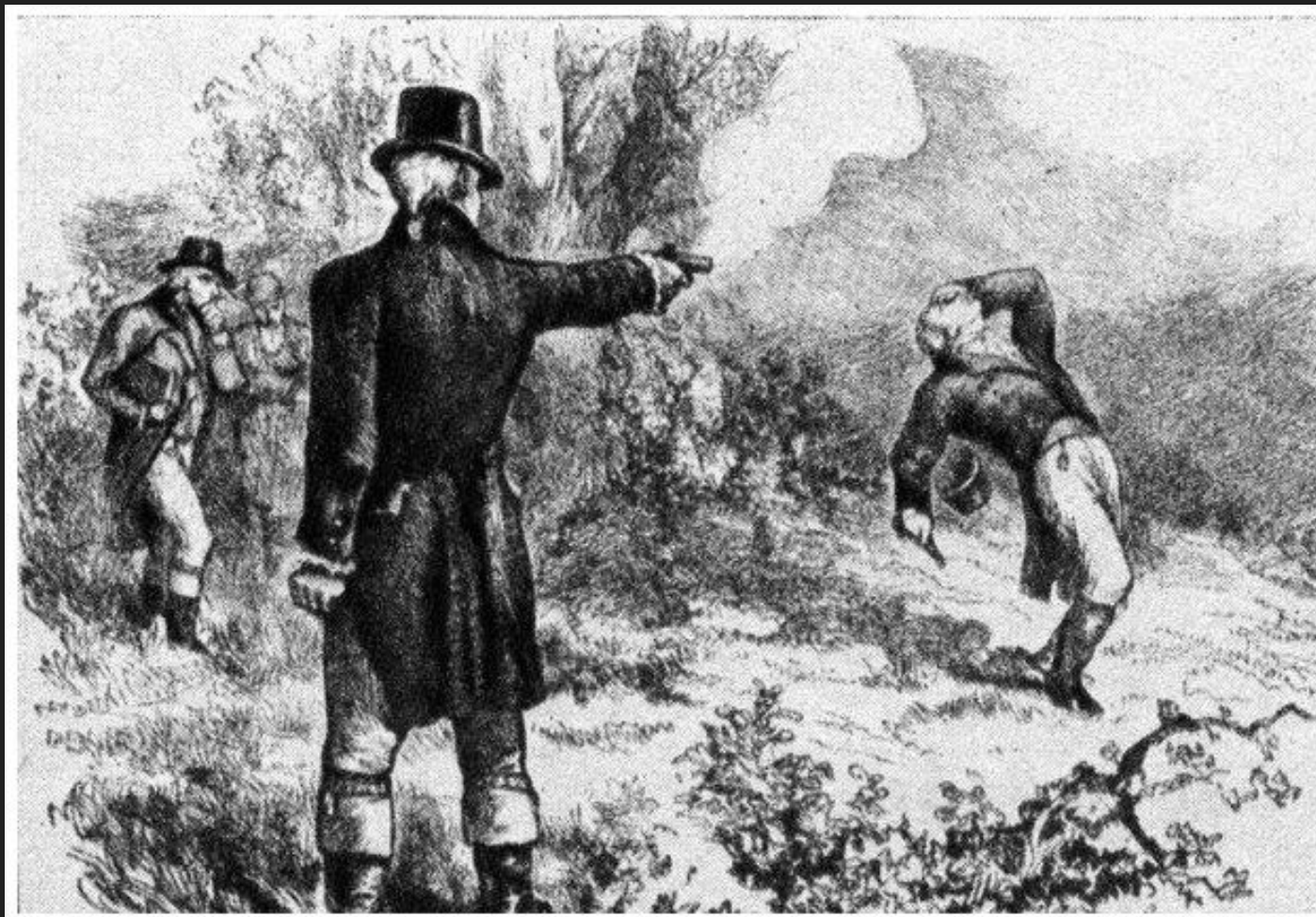

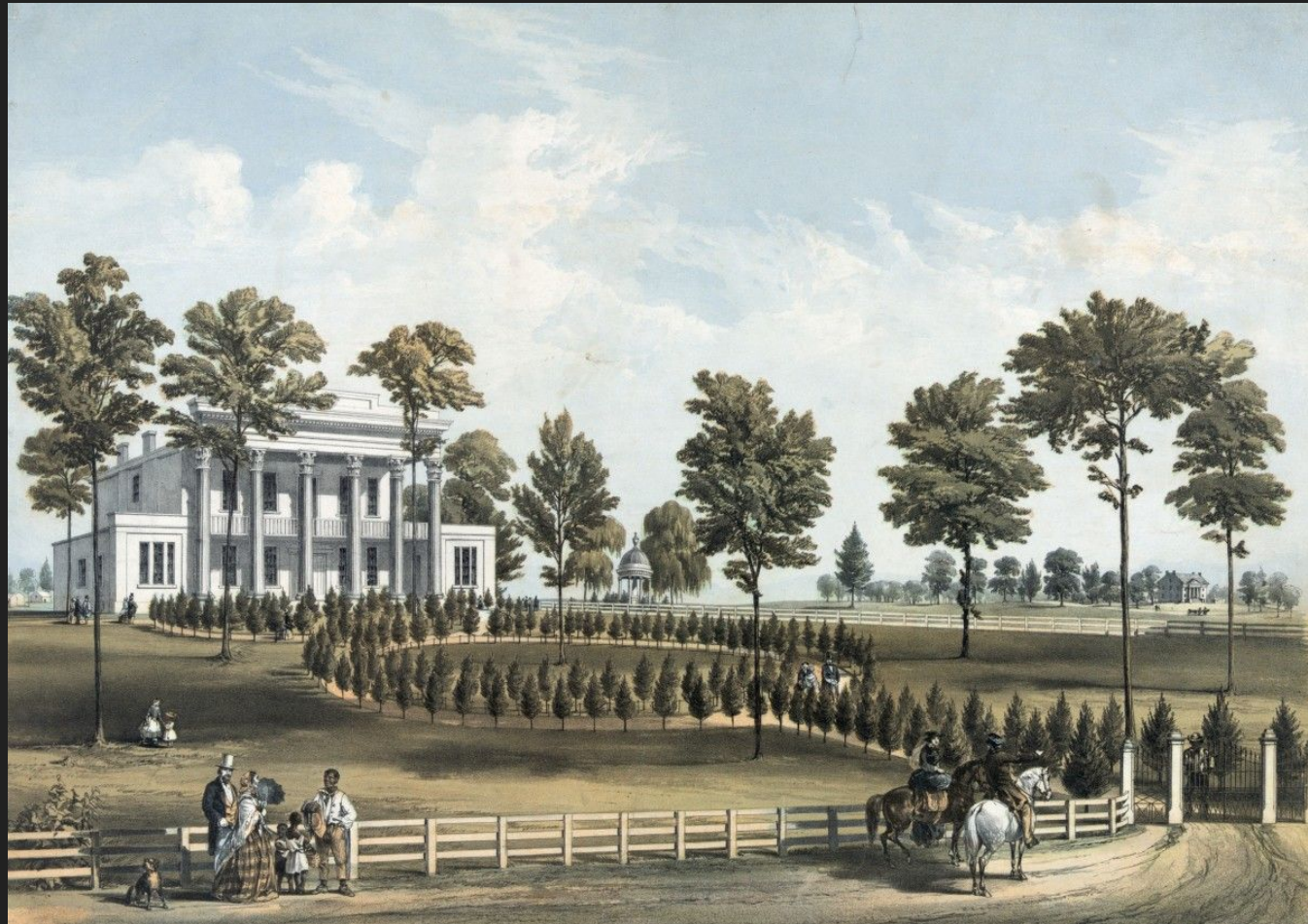


**Washington's Inauguration**



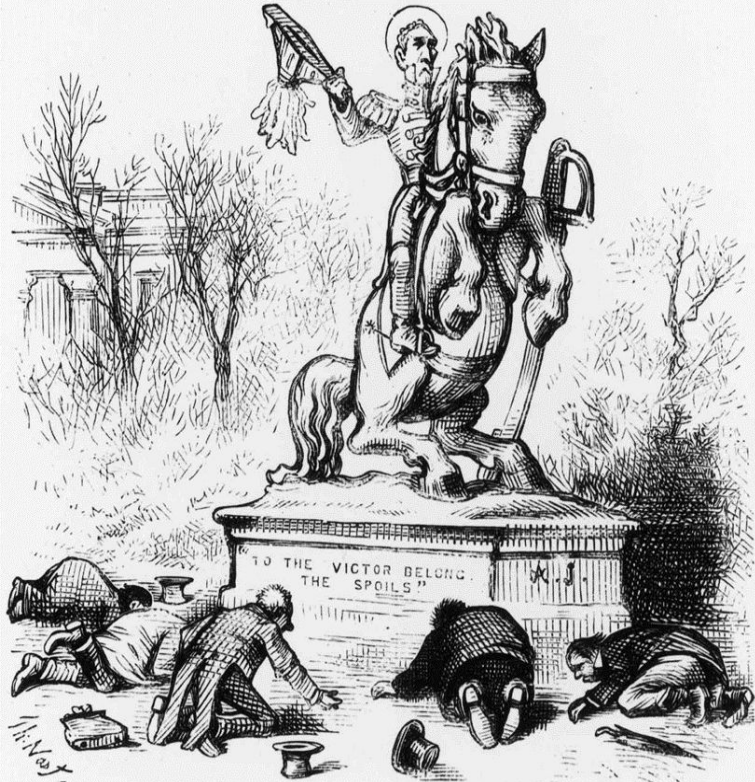
**Outside the White House
