- •26th Amendment lowered the minimum voting age from 21 to 18

Apollo 11 Lunar Landing


- •July 20, 1969 Lunar Module "Eagle" landed on the moon

Continuing Vietnam



- Bombing Campaigns
 - Bombings of supply routes in North Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia
- Invasion of Cambodia 1970
 - Troops were to find and destroy supply centers of the Viet Cong

Kent State

- students protested US involvement in Cambodia
- burned down the ROTC building
- National Guard sent in to establish order
- Campus protesters threw rocks at guards
- gunfire erupted killing four people





- Détente relaxation of tensions between Communist nations and the US
- •China -
 - China admitted to UN October 1971
 - Nixon visits February 1972
 - Opened diplomatic relations
 - Agreed neither would try to dominate Pacific




SALT I
